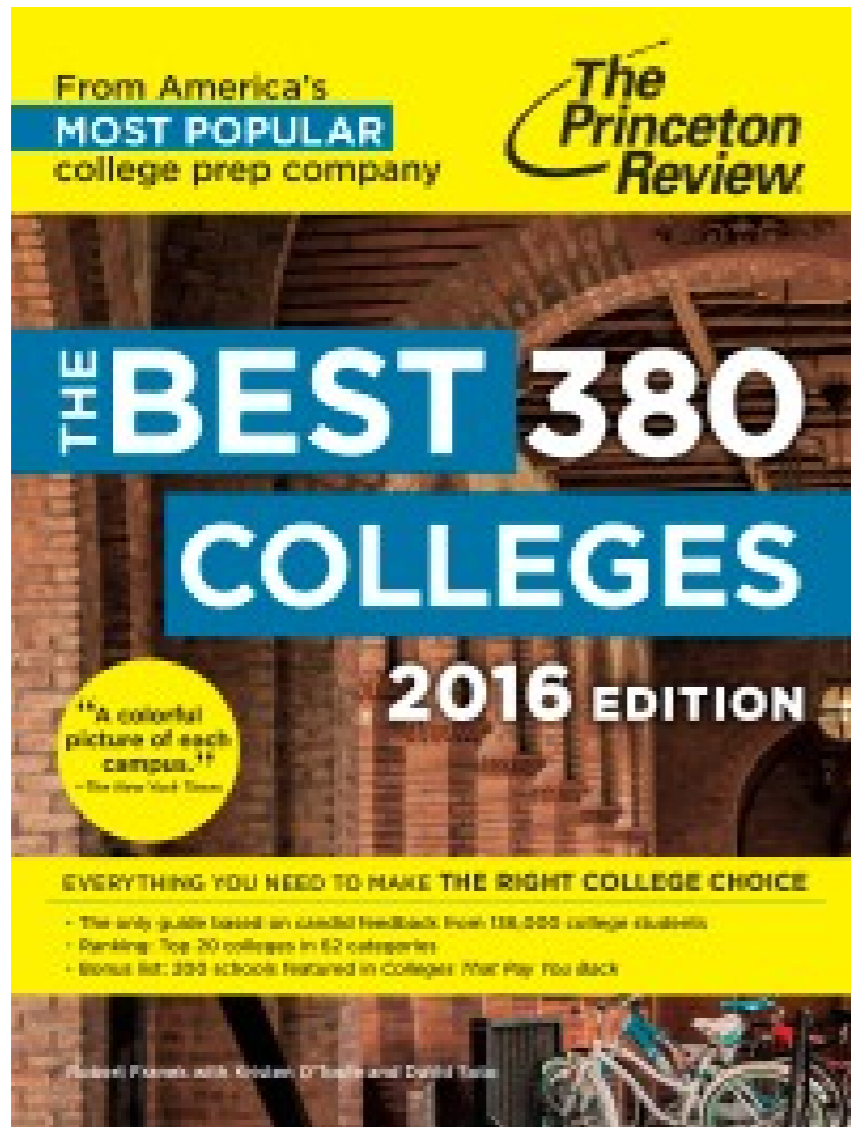


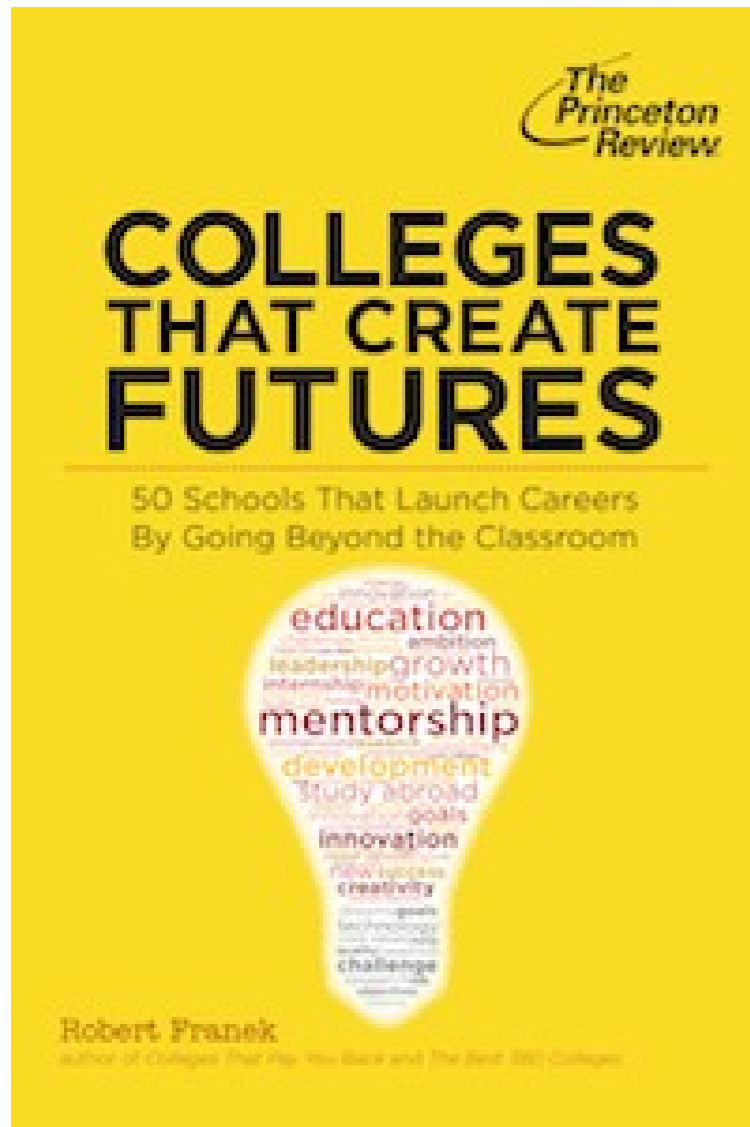


The Princeton Review recognizes Marist's Game Design program as one of the top 50 in the country.

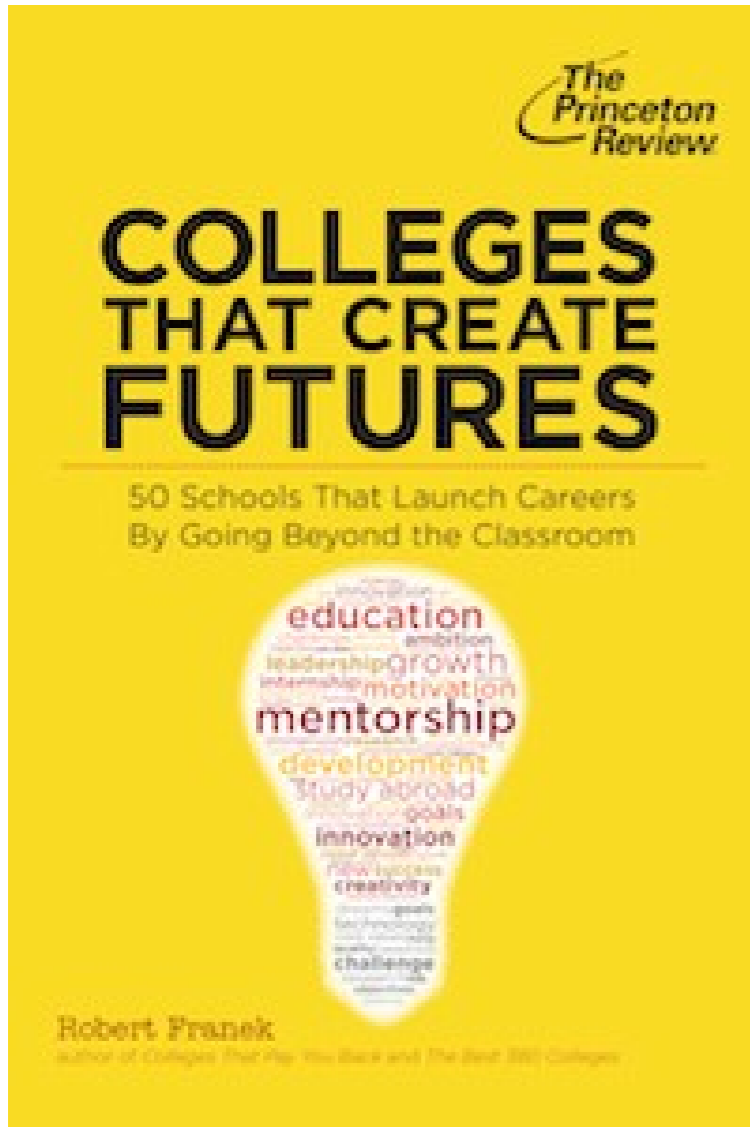

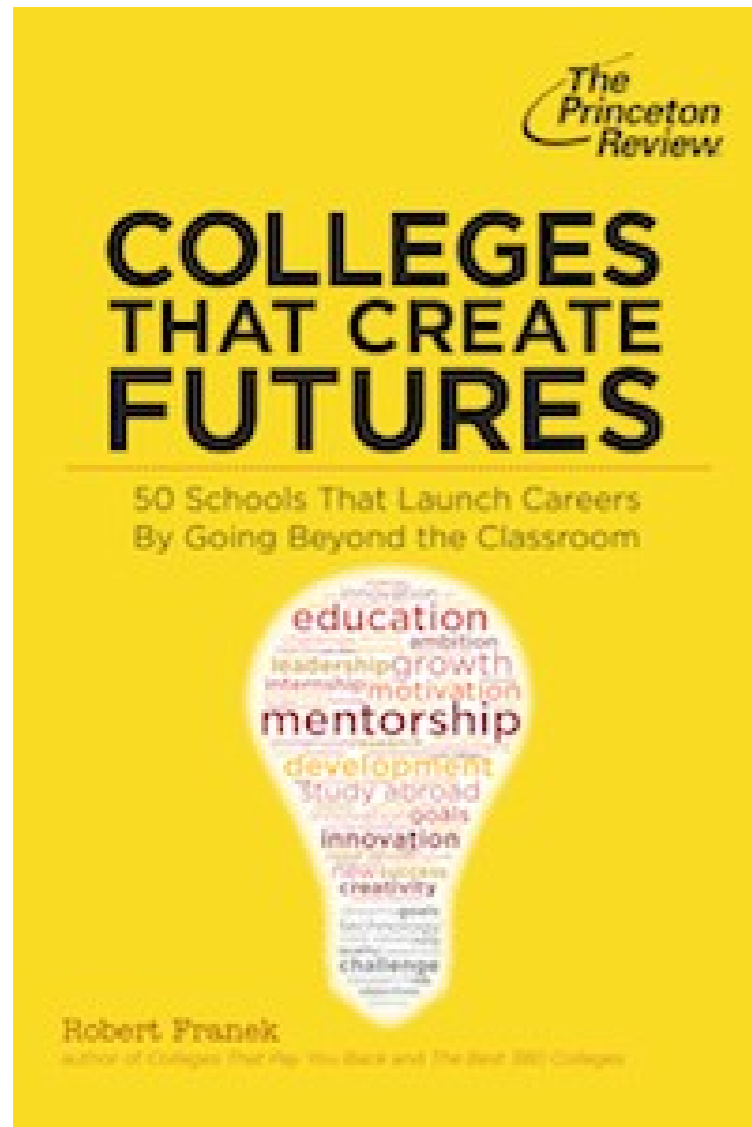
